ATTENTION SENIORS ATTENDING GRAD NITE ON MAY 21ST:



Important dates/deadlines:

Local Community College Applications

Seniors interested in attending one of our local community colleges should apply with priority registration through the "Registration To Go Program":

SCCCD (Fresno City, Oakhurst Center, Madera Center, Clovis Community, Reedley College)

Local Community College "Registration To Go" Steps

- 1. Application: Do ASAP
- 2. Online Orientation: December
- 3. Counseling / Advising with Student Educational Plan: March
- 4. Registration for classes: April if above steps are completed

*Community College is free when you enroll in at least 12 units and fill out the FAFSA.

FAFSA AND MONEY MATTERS (APPLY ASAP)

All seniors planning on attending any college or a career technical school:

TIP OF THE MONTH

Is Stress Your Friend or Foe?

The daily life of personalized learning can sometimes be stressful because it affects your time, resources, energy, and physical/mental health. Here are my tips for balancing and coping with that stress:

- 1. Do something that is just for you. This is important. As a parent and home educator, you are pulled in many directions. Find something you can regularly do that is all you and fills you up. This might be taking a short walk, creating something, watching a favorite show, listening to a podcast, going window shopping, playing an instrument, or anything that makes you feel recharged. Do something that is just for you and don't feel guilty about it.
- 2. You got this! Stressing about your ability or your child's ability does not serve any purpose. There are so many resources online, at our school, and within our community that can help you and your children get to your goals. Stop the doubts and go for it!
- **3.** Work hard and play hard. Personalized learning is hard work. It's tiring and takes over everything sometimes. Do the hard work, then take breaks and play hard. Play is important work, too. Feel good about both your hard work and your play time.

- 4. There will be bad days. Your best laid plans may explode in your face and nothing gets done. Things like the common cold can derail an entire school day (or week!). Do not stress about what didn't get done. Try to find educational nuggets in whatever is happening and let that bad day run its course. Tomorrow is a new day.
- **5. Organization helps.** Create goals, a schedule, and a plan to get things done. Organizing your thoughts, plans, and physical space can help reduce stress. Be proactive about your time and timeframes!
- **6. Use your resources.** Our school, the public library, and the internet are powerful resources. Someone has probably already stressed out about something you are worrying about and published their findings. Use their wisdom to lessen your stress.
- 7. **Stay connected.** Community is a great way to destress. When people gather to share ideas and struggles, it helps demystify things that may have seemed hard or impossible. Stay connected by joining (or creating) education groups or online chat groups. A monthly/weekly book club, park date, or exercise group can do wonders for you and your student.
- **8. Give yourself grace.** You and your student are on a unique educational journey. Give yourself grace to figure out what works best for your family. Give yourself grace to make mistakes and learn from them.
- **9. This time is precious.** Your child will grow up quickly. This time is a precious season in their growth. Enjoy the moments. Don't let stress rob you of these moments. Your child is this wonderful human being and you have the privilege of being both their parent and their educator!
- **10. Stress is my friend.** Stress is a part of life that helps move us forward. Stress will always be there in some shape or form. Move through that stress to greater accomplishments and success!
