
Now Forming


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

March: Leadership


Criteria: Highlight students who display leadership qualities, encourage teamwork, and inspire others to excel.

Curriculum Review by Sandra Hammond

Lightning Literature is a 1st through 8th grade English Language Arts (ELA) curriculum designed to "instill a love of literature in students, expand their ability to read intelligently and deeply, and prepare them for more advanced language arts concepts" (Hewitt Learning).

This curriculum integrates literature, grammar, mechanics, and composition. You will need to supplement spelling. It is a good fit for families seeking a literature approach to ELA (using whole books, rather than an anthology). Picture books and novels cover a wide range of genres and lessons are designed specifically for homeschooling families. Structured across 36 weeks, daily lessons in the conventions of writing use the text students are already reading and discussing.





ASVAB Test: Wednesday, March 6th, 12:15 PM - 2:15 PM at Endeavor

For 10-12th graders. The ASVAB CEP is a complete career planning program. Students are given the opportunity to take the ASVAB at no cost and no commitment to military service. The ASVAB CEP also provides an interest assessment and planning tools to help young adults explore career field entry requirements and various career paths, both military and civilian.

High school students in grades 10, 11 and 12 and those enrolled at post-secondary institutions can participate in the

ASVAB CEP. Students in 11th grade and beyond receive valid scores for enlistment.

Community College High School Enrichment Program:

The High School Enrichment (HSE) is the name of the program that affords an opportunity for students to take up to 11 units of community college classes that count for both high school and college credit per semester. One semester college class is equivalent to 1 year of high school, so 10 credits will be awarded. And, it will count as an honors class with a GPA bump.
