TECH ZONE

This month, in the Technology Corner, we are directing your attention to Digital Citizenship. Digital Citizenship represents the ethical decisions that we make on all pieces of technology. As our children navigate a tech-rich learning environment, what resources are available for us as parents/caregivers? How can we help our children/students make wise, helpful, good decisions across screens?

Here are a few questions to consider:

- 1) If your child has a cellphone, do you [parent] know how to block mature content on that device before you give it to them?
- 2) If your child has a cellphone, do your children know what to do if a stranger sends them a text message? Do they know how to block callers or texters?
 - 3) If someone starts to harass your child in an online chat forum, do they know how to respond to that situation?

CLASS SPOTLIGHT

Want to know what other classes are availabe at Endeavor? From Leadership to Computer Science, we offer a wide variety of classes for all interests. Each month, we will highlight different middle and high school classes to help expand your horizons and see what's out available!

ROV

For the past ten years, Endeavor Charter has offered students the opportunity to take part in the robotics program offered by Marine Advanced Technology Education (MATE). The ROV, or remotely operated vehicle, program offers a fun educational experience, while also providing a simulation of what life in the workplace is like, promoting collaboration and communication amongst students for the good of their team. From personal experience, our team, ECO-Tech, has benefited greatly from the technical skills taught in class, and we have grown in friendship with one another as a result of working and competing together.

So what exactly is the MATE ROV program? MATE II ROV is a STEM program that offers students the opportunity to find solutions to real world problems; such as climate change, coral bleaching, and sustainable energy. It is the desire of those at MATE to use STEM applications to inspire future generations of marine scientists and engineers. And the program accomplishes just that. Students collaborate with one another to design and market an ROV, and simulate real world tasks. Students are also taught technical skills such as soldering, waterproofing, mathematics, and researching that help them design and build their ROV.

The MATE ROV program often takes place in a classroom, where students can all participate in hands-on activities in constructing a ROV. However, work also continues outside the class. Students form a team with a minimum of 3 members and frequently meet outside of the class time. Before building an ROV, students may meet on a video conference to brainstorm ideas and designs on what their ROV could look like. In-person meetings are sometimes held at one of the individual's houses who may have a pool, so that students can practice driving the ROV underwater.

A Regional competition is held once a year in the Monterey Bay area, where teams from various parts of the state demonstrate their ROV completing real life underwater tasks. Teams also hold a marketing presentation where they show a panel of judges, who are scientists, engineers, and former Mate ROV participants.






