

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test

PSAT test for 8th - 11th graders: October 25th at 12PM The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT^{*}) is structured similarly to the SAT^{*}, has the same sections and timing, and measures the same Reading and Writing and Math skills students learn in the classroom—the knowledge and skills your child needs to succeed in college and career. The PSAT is a great way to see where the student is at academically, see what academic areas of improvement are, and is designed to help students prepare for the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).

The SAT is taken in the Spring of a student's junior year. The SAT is used primarily for scholarships and subject validation for college admissions.

We are offering the PSAT on Wednesday, October 25th at 12PM.

Please register at the front office by October 3rd. The test fee is: \$20 - payable to the front office. Exact cash or check is acceptable. The PSAT tests students in reading, writing and math skills. This test is designed to help students prepare for the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).

Grad Nite Deposit at Magic Mountain: \$25 FIRM

\$25 is due by November 3rd, 2023 to secure your spot. Please submit payment at the front desk.

Local Community College "Registration To Go" steps

- 1. Application: October
- 2. Online Orientation: November

3. Counseling / Advising with Student Educational Plan: Feb/March

4. Registration for classes: April if above steps are completed

Scholarship Opportunity:

The California Jaycee Foundation (CAJCF) annually gives scholarships of \$1,000 to graduating California high school seniors. This year the selection was from twenty candidates whose applications were very good. The CAJCF nominates two of the academic awardees and one vocational awardee to the USJCI Senate for consideration in the awarding its 35 scholarships of \$1,500 across 50 states.
