

GLACIER HIGH SCHOOL CHARTER COUNSELOR'S CORNER



LOCAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE INFORMATION

Seniors interested in attending one of our local community colleges after high school should apply with priority registration through the "Registration To Go" Program: The State Center Community College District (SCCCD) includes Fresno City College, Oakhurst Center, Madera Community College, Clovis Community and Reedley College.

Local Community College "Registration To Go" Instructions

- Application was available Oct.1st (This step should now be completed. Contact me if you have not finished the application).
- (2) Online Orientation: November/December (This should be completed now)
- Counseling / Advising with Student Educational Plan: Feb/March
- Once the above steps are completed, SAVE THE DATE! Monday, April 4, 2022: Advising Sessions at Fresno City College

This day is designated for all seniors at local Charter Schools and other Alt Ed Learning sites who want to attend Fresno City College in Summer/Fall 2022. On this day, students will meet with a Counselor for advising and will set up their Student Education Plan (SEP) for first semester courses. It is required that all new students meet with a Counselor before they can register for classes on the early registration dates of April 26, 27, and 28.

ASVAB

11th and 12th grade Parents/Students : ASVAB Test is Friday, February 9th, 2PM at Glacier High School.

What is the ASVAB? The ASVAB Career Exploration Program includes tests and activities that help you identify your interests and provides information about your Verbal Skills, Math Skills, and Science and Technical Skills. Who administers the ASVAB? The assessment will be administered by a recruiter for one of the armed services.

Does that mean I will be enlisted in the armed services if I complete the ASVAB? No.

Will my ASVAB scores be automatically reported to the armed services? No. Mr. Hill specifically selected the option for student scores NOT to be automatically forwarded to the Department of Defense, but families will have the option to have them forwarded if they would like to since the military is an excellent option for some students.

Why are we so excited that this is available to Glacier students? The results include very thorough information about the areas assessed and the students' score; and of course, it provides information about roles in the armed forces where people with certain skill-sets often excel. What might not be expected is the wealth of information about civilian careers that is also included. So, if you are not planning on going into the military, it's still a good test to take!

Who benefits most from the results of this assessment? We recommend that all juniors and seniors complete the ASVAB.

CAREER SPOTLIGHT - NURSING

Nursing offers a wide range of career opportunities—from entry-level practitioner to doctoral-level researcher. Nurses are hands-on health professionals who provide focused and highly personalized care. They are also in demand—employment of registered nurses is projected to grow 16% from 2014 to 2024, much faster than the average for all occupations, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Nurses provide and coordinate patient care, educate patients and the public about various health conditions, and provide advice and emotional support to patients and their family members.

Although an entry-level nurse can find a job with a 2 or 3-year RN degree, there is a growing national movement to require all nurses to hold a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree. Once you are a nurse, you might choose to focus on a particular specialty. There are numerous specialty options to choose from!

TYPES OF NURSES:

Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN):

LVNs typically have a certificate or two-year degree and provide basic bedside care to the patients. They are directed by the physicians or RNs and have to work accordingly.

Registered Nurse (RN):

RNs have, at the minimum, a two-year or four- year degree. RNs have an expanded set of duties and are more frequently employed in hospital settings. They are generally expected to do more critical thinking on the job.

Nurse Practitioner (NP):

An NP is an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse who has additional responsibilities for administering patient care than RNs. NPs can prescribe medication, examine patients, diagnose illnesses, and provide treatment, much like physicians do.
