

"REGISTRATION TO GO" PROGRAM FOR LOCAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Seniors interested in attending one of our local community colleges after high school should apply with priority registration through the "Registration To Go" Program:

The State Center Community College District (SCCCD) includes Fresno City College, Oakhurst Center, Madera Community College, Clovis Community and Reedley College.

1. Application was available Oct.1st (Should be submitted)

2. Online Orientation: November/December (Should be completed)

3. Counseling / Advising Session & Student Educational Plan: 4/4/22

4. Register for Classes: April 26, 27, 28 if above steps are completed

This day is designated for all seniors at local Charter Schools and other Alt Ed Learning sites who want to attend Fresno City College in Summer/Fall 2022. On this day, students will meet with a Counselor for advising and will set up their Student Education Plan (SEP) for first semester courses. It is required that all new students meet with a Counselor before they can register for classes on the early registration dates of April 26, 27, and 28.

Spring is a good time to visit colleges. When planning your campus visits, make sure to allow time to explore each college. While you're there, talk to as many people as possible. These can include college admission staff, professors, and students.
