CA Physical Fitness Testing is Approaching

Every year the California Department of Education requires that all 5th, 7th, and 9th grade students be administered a battery of five physical fitness tests. The window for those tests is between February 1 and May 31. At MHS/GHS, we will administer the tests during the week of March 4.

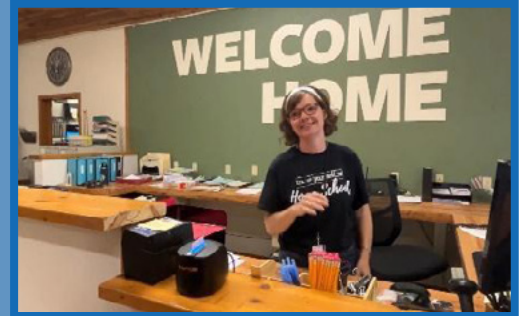

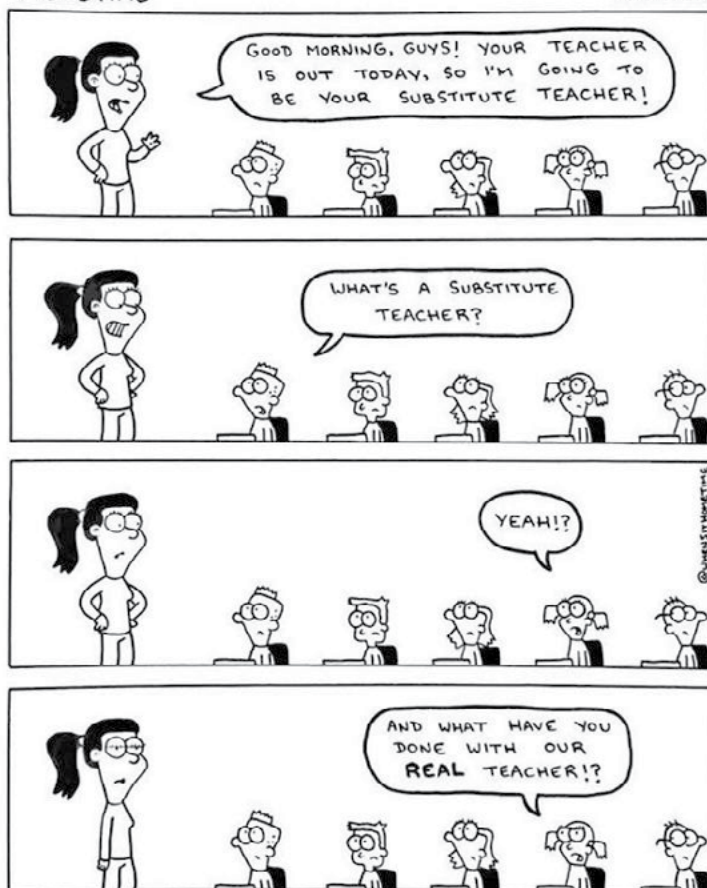
