

On Friday, November 3, Leadership students from Glacier and Endeavor High Schools will return to the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library in Simi Valley for the 8th time. Why is this trip included year after year? Because every year, student descriptions of the trip include things like "unforgettable", "eye opening", that they were "greatly impacted",

and that "the library reminded me how far-reaching and impactful events in history are and inspired me to be a more active citizen."

A more detailed schedule will be available to Leadership class families in October and they can look forward to students and staff traveling to Simi Valley in a chartered tour bus. For part of the day, the group will tour the

grounds and museum including seeing a portion of the Berlin Wall, walking through Air Force One and Marine One, and viewing many interactive and exciting displays. During the rest of the time at the library, the group will participate in a simulation of an actual event from Ronald Reagan's presidency with each of the students fulfilling a specific role from the scenario.

All High School Students - "Counseling Connection"

I am hosting a weekly "College & Career Counseling Connection" for students. It is an informational meeting for high school students every Tuesday morning from 10AM-10:15AM via Zoom. A zoom link was sent out through ParentSquare with information about the topics I will be covering. The topics will include College/Career and postgraduate information. Here are the topics for the month of September:

- 10/3 Understanding the PSAT and SAT test
- 10/10 Why attend a community college & How to apply
- 10/24 Cal Fire Guest speaker
- 10/31 Earn college credits while in high school

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test

PSAT test for 9th - 11th graders: October 26th at 12-4PM The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT\*) is structured similarly to the SAT\*, has the same sections and timing, and measures the same Reading and Writing and Math skills students learn in the classroom—the knowledge and skills your child needs to succeed in college and career. The PSAT is a great way to see where the student is at academically, see what academic areas of improvement are, and is designed to help students prepare for the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).

The SAT is taken in the Spring of a student's junior year. The SAT is used primarily for scholarships and subject validation for college admissions.

### We are offering the PSAT on Thursday, October 26th at 12-4PM.

Please register at the front office by October 3rd. The test fee is: \$20 - payable to the front office. Exact cash or check is acceptable. The PSAT tests students in reading, writing and math skills. This test is designed to help students prepare for the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT).

#### Grad Nite Deposit at Magic Mountain: \$25

\$25 is due by November 3rd, 2023 to secure your spot. Please submit payment at the front desk. Grad Nite will be Thursday, May 23rd, 2024. Total ticket

price to be determined. Look for more details to come on ParentSquare.

Grad night registration includes a Six Flags Magic Mountain Grad Pass (a season pass that allows students to come back to the park for the rest of 2024 with only black out dates during Fright Fest).

- 4. Registration for classes: April if above steps are completed

#### Scholarship Opportunity:

The California Jaycee Foundation (CAJCF) annually gives scholarships of \$1,000 to graduating California high school seniors. The CAJCF nominates two of the academic awardees and one vocational awardee to the USJCI Senate for consideration in the awarding its 35 scholarships of \$1,500 across 50 states.
