

Picture packages will be available for purchase (cash, check, or credit card)


Student ID's will be available for Glacier High School students only.

- 1. Application: October/November
- 2. Online Orientation: November
- 3. Counseling / Advising with Student Educational Plan: Feb/March
- 4. Registration for classes: April if above steps are completed

FAFSA AND MONEY MATTERS

All seniors planning on attending any college or a career technical school: FAFSA application opens October 1st, 2020.

Look for college/trade school scholarships wherever you apply. Both community colleges and universities have opened their scholarship application window.

Seniors: The GE-Reagan Foundation Scholarship Program rewards college-bound students who demonstrate exemplary leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship with financial assistance to pursue higher education.

Each year, the Program selects numerous recipients to receive a \$10,000 scholarship renewable for up to an additional three years – up to \$40,000 total per recipient. Awards are for undergraduate study and may be used for education-related expenses, including tuition, fees, books, supplies, room, and board.

ASVAB Test: 10th, 11th, 12 grades: Coming in January, date TBD

ASVAB stands for the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery, which is a multiple-choice test that helps you identify which Army jobs (Military Occupational Specialties) would be best for you. This test is an excellent resource even if you are not planning on enlisting in the military.

9th, 10, 11th graders: PSAT - Coming in January TBD
